235,000 American soldiers, 3000 planes and helicopters: every day this enormous war machine pours bombs, rockets, napalm, poison gas and toxic chemicals on Vietnamese land.

Air Marshall Ky.

And here is the Americans' hired killer, Nguen Cao Ky.

Troops evacuating village, burning hut in background.

The Yankees are putting Vietnam to fire and sword.

U.S. soldier entering hut.

But fire calls for fire, and blood for blood.

People wading in water.

The ground is burning under the feet of the aggressors, and fire destroys their planes in the sky.

Torture scenes; the submersion of man in water jar.

Here we are back to the time of Hitlerite atrocities, of medieval torture.

Planes on bombing run.

Bombs . . . rockets . . . napalm . . . poison gas . . . toxic chemicals. The Vietnamese land is put to fire and sword. To fire . . . and sword.

Man bending over dead wife.

Hitler did not dare to resort to chemical warfare. Lyndon Johnson has practiced it on a large scale.

Carrier-based aircraft bombing countryside.

North Vietnam, the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, an independent, sovereign state 10,000 miles away from the United States. Without any reason, without any war declaration, Washington has arrogated to itself the right to have North Vietnam bombed every day--for more than a year now.

February 9, 1966: children at Huong Phuc were going to school, as they did every morning. Planes came, poured bombs and rockets, and 5% of the children were either killed or crippled for life.

Dead leper on ground (after survey of hospital ruins).

Here at Quyn Lap 2,800 lepers were hospitalized. In July 1965, U.S. aircraft launched repeated ferocious raids on the hospital for several days. Results: hundreds of killed and wounded, and over 2000 lepers without shelter and medical care.

An entire people have risen up and directed their hatred against the aggressors.

- + This is the Phu Luong bridge on our line of defence;  
we stand ready to punish the American air pirates.

American aircraft -- Ack-ack guns firing:

- + After the battle, the defenders of Phu Luong bridge happily get everything ready to celebrate the lunar New Year right on the battle field. They always stand ready to keep a sharp lookout to secure a peaceful New Year for the people.

Representatives of the people visiting the armymen:

- + Those who defend the sky during the New Year Festival are well looked after: representatives of the local people go to the battle field early on the first day of the New Year to greet them.

Offering cigaretts, cakes and sweets:

- + The visit takes place in a cheerful atmosphere. These little gifts speak the feeling of affection between the people and the army and give the day a festive air. The armymen are elated and deeply moved by the new year visit of the local people.

An officer talking:

- + We pledge to endeavour to study and fight in spite of difficulties and sacrifices, to defeat the American aggressors and to defend the people's happy lives. We are determined to keep our promise.

A man playing accordion:

- + The songs praising the great fighting life of our army-men and the heroic fighting spirit and the glorious victories of the people in both zones, North and South, in the struggle against the American aggressors rise above this battle field, Uong Bi.

An artist performing a dance:

- + The Hai Ninh Art-Ensemble brings poems, songs and dances to the armymen on the battle field. The presence of the artists on New Year festive days makes the defenders of Uong Bi more cheerful and their performance seems to last long after they have left.

Armed men and artists shaking hands:

- + Thanks comrade artists of Hai Ninh ! Thanks for your songs and music which urges us to action. This is a memorable art-performance.

People buying goods:

- + And here in Hanoi, capital of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam, people are happily preparing for the New Year's Festive days.

Girls watching flowers:

- + New Year's festival in Hanoi is as cheerful and as beautiful as ever.

Workers in factory:

- + During New Year festive days, workers and self-defence units of the Tran-hung-Dao engineering plant are doing their utmost to raise the quality of their products at the same time keeping a watchful eye on the enemy.

Water pump:

- + The coop members and militiamen of Giang-Vo, a village in the suburbs of Hanoi, launch a production emulation drive right on the first day of the New Year and are ready for battle.

A group on guard duty:

- + To celebrate the festive days, Hanoi is boosting production emulation drives and at the same time keeping a watchful eye on the enemy.

Loading a truck:

- + Like many lorry services, the Hanoi lorry service no.3 actively prepares to serve ~~front~~ the front.

Ornamenting trucks:

- + Instead of spending the New Year holidays at home we shall spend them on the road. However, we shall have as much fun.

Offering gifts and cakes to the drivers:

- + They are given good cars by the people at home: Plenty of flowers, glutinous rice cakes, aromatic tea, sweets, jam...

Drivers entering their trucks:

- + Every driver is pleased to spend the new year holidays far from home for he knows that while the people in the rear are peacefully enjoying their holidays, the struggle is still going on at the front and his help is needed.

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# PROGRESS REPORT

Dear Friends:

February 4, 1967

The following is a general progress and information report to all our friends, addressing ourselves especially to the many who asked to be kept on our mailing list.

As the War grows in all its horror, so does the determination of the Vietnamese to resist and to win. One of their recently expressed slogans in Vietnam Courier is certainly appropriate: "YANKEE GO HOME! -- FOR INDEPENDENCE AND PEACE, THE VIETNAMESE PEOPLE WILL FIGHT UNTILL FINAL VICTORY!"

## OUR ACTIVITIES IN THE PAST YEAR

Included the following:

- \* Participation in most demonstrations in NYC area and related activities.
- \* Held more than 100 street meetings and literature tables, aver. 8hrs @.
- \* Vietnamese film showings held at ARG.
- \* 8000+ copies of Vietnam Courier sold.
- \* 4000+ Vietnamese books sold to sch's, libraries, groups and individuals.
- \* Acted as a clearing-house on matters relating to the Vietnamese and the War for groups and individuals around the country - this was our most demanding and frequent activity.
- \* Many other activities -- see below...

## HUAC

As most of you know, we participated in the "circus" in the "boyl room" in Wash. D.C. last Aug. The night before they were to be questioned, Dr. Krebs of the Free School and W. Teague, Chairman of USCANLF-SV prepared a statement to be read to HUAC declaring their disdain of that Congressional committee and their intention to walk out of the hearings.

Before they could read their statements one of their lawyers, Mr. Kinoy, was brutally carried out of the room by his neck. Krebs and Teague tried then to read their statements, but were also forced out of the hearing room. Later they read their statements to the press.

By refusing to return to the hearings, they left themselves open to indictment for Contempt of Congress. A danger that passed as of Jan. 1st, 1967.

## ARRESTS - SUMMONS - COURTS - ADINFINITUM

During 1966 we were threatened with arrest many times. We won two cases; Obstructing the Sidewalk and Holding a Street Meeting Without a Flag. There are two cases still pending; Not Having a Proper U.S. Flag at a Street Meeting and Disorderly Conduct. All of these cases have been ably handled by the NYCLU.

Our next court appearances are: 10 Feb. and 21 Feb., both at 100 Centre St., 9:30 AM in Part 1-C. Why not come down and hear us be charged with displaying a "North VietCong" flag, whatever that is?

## GOVERNMENT SEIZURES OF VIETNAMESE BOOKS!

Just after completing a mailing to all 1,500 College newspapers throughout the country, offering them Vietnamese Literature, we were notified by the U. S. Treasury Dept., Bureau of Customs that they had seized thousands (Now over 10,000) of Vietnamese books coming to us from outside the country. Later, books and other materials destined to other groups were also seized. NYCLU lawyer Henry Winestine is handling the case and it is now in the courts. In the Treasury Dept's letters, they state they will destroy the books in 45 days "(or sooner if you should so request)!"

## VIETNAMESE FILMS!!!

Since late in 1966 we have been distributing copies of Viet. films to colleges, High Schools and various groups covering over 20 cities so far and more scheduled. In most cases the films are shown many times each rental. In Salt Lake City for example, the films were shown to a High School, ROTC group, Brigham Young U. over 2,000 attendance, Joe Hill House ( founder of I.W.W. ) and several home showings. See if you can arrange for a showing to your school or group. Gov. films are being shown all around the country, this demands that equal time be given to the Vietnamese!

## RADIO HAVANA : "VIET NAM TODAY"

Radio Havana shortwave broadcasts in English to the U. S. now have a new News program: "VIET NAM TODAY." A great show with the U. S. the aggressor and the Vietnamese being honored for once. The point of view is a historical and psychological one, in contrast to the denial of all but economic and material factors expressed in neat statistics which form the basis for official U. S. neglect of relevant antecedents.

## THE LIBERAL ARGUMENT

- All sides are to blame for the war in Vietnam.
- Peace at any price.
- The war in Vietnam is an unfortunate accident.
- The war in Vietnam is the work of a small clique of hawks.
- The United Nations should negotiate a settlement between the United States and the Vietnamese.
- National Liberation Movements are exploited by Communists for nefarious ends.

## THE RADICAL ARGUMENT

- The United States is the aggressor—the Vietnamese are fighting for liberation from foreign domination.
- There can be no peace without liberation.
- The war in Vietnam is both deliberate and necessary because American capitalism can't survive without crushing social revolutions everywhere.
- The war in Vietnam is the agreed-upon policy of those who possess power in America.
- The only role the United Nations should play is to levy sanctions against the aggressor nation: the United States.
- Communists who lead revolutions against oppression and exploitation should be supported.

The April 15 Spring Mobilization marks the consolidation of an "Official Movement" two years in the making. Its primary goal has been to build a movement of all those "opposed" to the war—for whatever reasons—that will, through force of numbers alone, "pressure" the U.S. government into changing its policies. During those two years the U.S. has at least DOUBLED its forces in Vietnam, destroyed the industrial base of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam and is now preparing an invasion of the D.R.V.—and perhaps of China. During those two years the U.S. "peace" movement has succeeded in becoming, in effect, the government's "Loyal Opposition."

With the deliberately ambiguous slogan of "Stop the War Now!" it has obscured the most fundamental character of the war in Vietnam: that it is a ruthless, predatory intervention by U.S. business and military interests to drive back and crush a social revolution—a revolution that is the only road to liberation for the Vietnamese masses.

We are not neutral in this struggle but rather are FOR THE VICTORY of that revolution. We feel that any demand less than the immediate unconditional withdrawal of all U.S. forces from Vietnam lends objective support to the U.S. policy of armed intervention against social revolutions throughout the world. While we differ on many things, ALL of us are in solidarity with the struggle of the National Liberation Front, and believe that, along with our counterparts around the world, we are struggling against the same enemy.

Dear Friends:

Recently we sent out a "Progress Report" on our activities in 1966. Some people didn't receive theirs, so if you want one, give us a call or send a note.

Since first obtaining copies of Vietnamese films last October, we have been able to provide for over 150 showings to date. The next important showing will be in the evening of May 18th, on WGBH-TV in Boston, Mass. They plan to show at least three of our films and have questions from the viewers afterwards.

The next local street showing will be Sunday, May 14th at the "Shell" in Tompkins Square Park or if we can't obtain the Parks Dept. Permit, the films will be shown on the street at the intersection of Avenue A and Saint Marks Place about 7:30PM. Also we will have sound equipment and a literature table on "A" and St. Marks from 1PM on that day. Come by and help if you can.

"RADIO FREE ALLIED FORCES"

Another new effort we are involved in is the preparing of taped radio shows to be broadcast to the U. S. forces in South Vietnam.

Our first shows are already on their way and we have materials for many more in preparation.

We hope to present weekly shows designed to honestly present the thoughts of the American Peace Movement to the young and illinformed Americans in South Vietnam. We will avoid the over-moral, hyper-intellectual or "Communist Propaganda" approach. Rather, we want to use material that will be accepted by the G.I. precisely because it relates to his needs and questions.

We are now interviewing young Black men who have refused to go and Black ex-G.I.'s who are against the war. We are most interested in securing interviews with relatives of G.I.'s now in Vietnam, whatever the particular shade of their "Anti-War" position. There is now, no other way than RADIO HANOI to reach young Americans in South Vietnam.

What they ordinarily hear about the Peace Movement through Armed Forces Radio or the Stars and Stripes etc., actually works against our goals. Here is a way for Americans to speak to Americans without any censor in the way.

Imagine the effect if they begin to hear "Joe's mother," "Mike's whole family" and "Sgt. Brown" on their portables - and they are all saying "The war is wrong and the troops should come home, now!"



If you've ever asked yourself, "What can we do?" here is a way to influence the war in Vietnam by speaking directly to the young men who aim the guns.

Help us to convince them not to kill Vietnamese and to keep their heads down until they can come home.

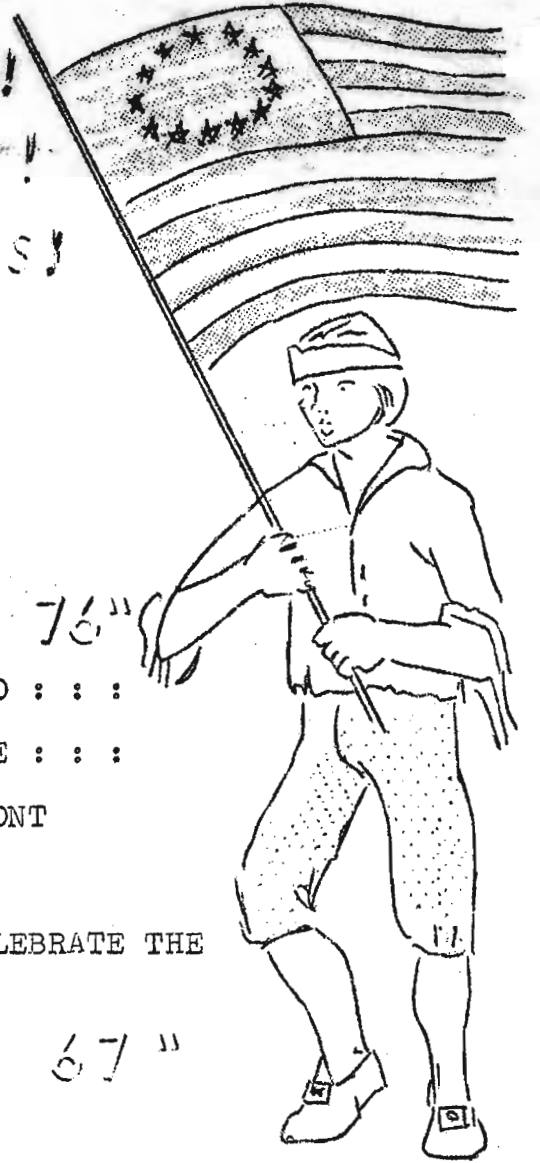
NEW YORK (June 30)--Members of three groups opposed to U.S. policy in Vietnam will present an Independence Pageant Sunday (July 2) to remind Americans of their native revolutionary ideals.

The pageant will begin in Columbus Circle (northeast segment) at noon. The principal design element will be a representation of the American Spirit of 1776 combined with a representation of the Vietnamese revolutionary spirit of 1967. Many of the participants will wear authentic American and Vietnamese revolutionary uniforms and will carry the revolutionary flags of both nations.

Sponsors of the pageant are Veterans and Reservists to End the War in Viet Nam, the U.S. Committee to Aid the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam, and the Revolutionary Contingent.

"Americans seem to have short memories," said Robin Palmer, a former paratrooper and a member of the veterans' group. "After all, it was less than 200 years ago that we in this country went through the same kind of struggle for independence that the Vietnamese are waging now. We must stop acting like Red Coats in Vietnam."

Dear Friends,

The following miscellany is offered to bring you up to date on the activities of our committee and in the hope that we may be of some service in your Peace efforts.

THE AIM OF OUR COMMITTEE is to help Americans realize that "our" government is criminally wrong in Vietnam and that the Vietnamese who defend their country in both north and south against U. S. Military aggression deserve our unreserved support.

THE ONLY "ENEMIES" Americans have in Vietnam are the Generals, politicians and industrialists who profit from the deaths, both American and Vietnamese, that they cause. We also want to help Americans become aware that the Liberation Struggles throughout the world are "OF", "FOR" and "BY" the people and should be supported, not feared. Our enemy is here - in the rottenness of our system, a system we must begin to replace, for the good of ourselves and all mankind.

MANY PEOPLE have written and asked how they could be helpful in their own area. We suggest to all that if you straight-off and without any compromise voice your support and admiration for the Vietnamese Liberation Struggle ("and your anger at the waste of American lives lost in an unjust and unnecessary war") you will immediately discover more to do than you can handle. Young Americans are being forced to give their lives supposedly for the "Independence" of "South Vietnam" (of course you know better -- but remember, they don't!) so shouldn't we who consider ourselves informed, moral and mature be willing to risk some initial irritation from our fellows? If the truth hurts - accept the need to meet and go beyond the "pain." It might have been a lot easier to speak the truth about Vietnam several years ago, before so many American "boys" began to get killed, but soon it may be too late to even try, if we wait until there is no Vietnam! or the war is carried into China!

#### NEWS

#### BITS AND PEICES SINCE THE LAST PROGRESS REPORT

**IN COURT** Our court cases continue. We just lost our motion to have the books seized by the Customs Department released. They now hold over 400 packages of ours and many destined to other groups. The court's decision more or less stated: "Foreign policy needs are more important than the slight inconvenience of filing for a licence." Actually there may be many restrictions accompanying the licence, if they do issue it. The ACLU will appeal.

**DEMONSTRATION FILMS** The Vietnamese have asked for films of the April 15th demonstrations. We've inquired around but heard nothing yet. They will certainly want copies of film taken on Oct. 21. We will forward any prints that you can help us obtain.

**BOOKS TO VIETNAM** The Vietnamese have asked for multiple copies of all U. S. printed books and pamphlets on Vietnam. We just - (cont.)



can't afford to buy all the books they need, so please send us all you can spare, especially the more expensive hard bound titles. They would be more usefull in the hands of the Vietnamese than on your shelf getting dusty. We guarantee delivery.

N L F AID (\$) Several years ago, we publicized addresses to which people could send \$ for the Vietnamese -- unfortunately U. S. Treasury interference has blocked all such methods. Since we dont know if it is exactly legal to say we are able to forward your donations to the Vietnamese, we won't say it!!!

SLOWLY and ironically, the more moderate groups and individuals in the Peace Movement are begining to realize that the most correct view of the problems of Vietnam is that of the Vietnamese themselves, a view expressed as far back as 1955 - and long before. Slowly they are realizing that the only just and possible end to the Vietnamese War is for the U. S. to get out -- for it is the U. S. that is the aggressor. We urge all to overcome their fear of antagonizing those few Americans who really can't be reached anyway and speak out clearly to the many others that need to know. Explain that it is the U. S. government and military that are wrong, guilty, the aggressor and that it is not the few ex-French Colonialist employees in Saigon who represent the people of Vietnam, but the great mass of other Vietnamese who are defending themselves and their homeland - against "our" government's aggression. Let's begin to point out publically, that if a small group of men in power can, without consulting us, select a few Vietnamese to "support," we can choose another, much larger group of Vietnamese to support. \*\*\* SEE YOU IN WASH., D. C. OCT. 21, JOIN US, WE WILL BE MARCHING WITH THE VIETNAMESE FOR A VIETNAMESE VICTORY! "

FILMS: We have supplied Vietnamese films to be shown in over 150 different locations throughout the country and in Canada, including Film Festivals such as the Lincoln Center, Fifth New York Film Festival, T. V. (Boston's channel 2) and most successfully at openair street showings in New York City and elsewhere. We urge local groups to consider showing films, out in the open, on the street, in their own area. It is a most effective method of really reaching people and contrary to some people's initial reaction to the suggestion, street film showings are safer and more orderly than normal street meetings. HERE IS AN EFFECTIVE METHOD TO STOP TALKING TO OURSELVES AND REACH THE COMMUNITY. WE WILL NEVER GET ANYWHERE IF WE ARE AFRAID TO TALK TO ANYONE WHO DISAGREES WITH US!


Recently we began producing a taped radio show of American opinion against the Vietnam war for broadcast over the English language programmes of Radio Hanoi. Its purpose is to give the G.I's in South Vietnam an opportunity to understand the Anti-Viet Nam War Movement - not from the usual propaganda point of view, which they hear too often, but through interviews with Americans against the war, of many viewpoints; Vietnam Veterans, draft resisters, well known Americans and most important, relatives of G. I's now in Vietnam. This is to be a straight-forward, honest approach designed to be accepted as valid by the young, skeptical G. I. If it is to be a success, we need help. Most of all we need people willing to speak to those Americans most affected by the war, not through an occasional letter, or leaflet, but through a weekly or daily radio show directly to all who want to listen.

The Vietnamese are willing, now it is up to us. If you know of anyone who is against the war and has a relative now in Vietnam, send us their name and address, or better yet, have them make a 25 minute or shorter taped statement on a fairly good tape recorder at 7 1/2 in's per minute and send it to us - or make one yourself. We need extra tapes, equipment, records of the latest Rock and other music, letters from Vietnam including the problems of the servicemen, that we may quote from - and anything else you think might help. Money help a lot too. We feel that this is a most unique opportunity and should not be wasted.

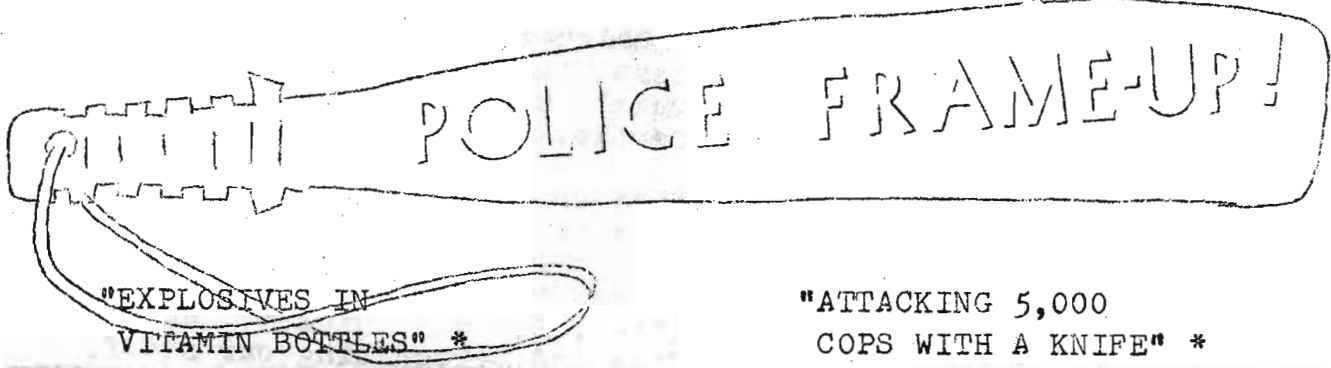

## WHAT REALLY HAPPENED ! ?

Mike's satchel containing works from Mao, Marx, Che, Debray and the Vietnamese along with two Vitamin bottles - was stolen. Two weeks later the cops called him to come down to retrieve it. He did and was arrested just as he discovered that the vitamins had changed into a strange powder! Mike is a young, new, committed activist in the movement. His potential and future deserve the support of all us "Old Hands."

5,000 police surrounded and infiltrated the N.Y.C. STDW Demonstration on Fri., Dec. 8th. A friend of the USCANLF-SV, Robin Palmer, had decided to carry the NLF-SV banner. Walter and others of the committee stayed near to defend him against Right-Wing attacks. After more than 10 unsuccessful R. W. attacks, the police them-

selves charged in and tried to get the banner away from Robin. Their horses squashed the demonstrators against the buildings, injuring many. After several attempts, Walter was singled out, beaten and arrested. Still, they had not gotten to the NLF-SV banner. As part of their "Cat and Mouse" game they then forced Walter back into the demonstrators ranks. Just as Walter reached Robin's side, the cops attacked again, beating Robin severely, first in the head and then in the groin. Later in the Precinct House, the arresting officers conferred with Police Legal Officials and various, unidentified men from "out of town." Finally they charged Walter with: Assaulting a Policeman with a knife, Inciting to Riot, possession of a dangerous weapon, disorderly conduct and other charges.

CONSIDERING the state of the lower courts, their collusion with the fascist tactics of the NYC Police, and recent convictions of "assault against nightsticks with defendants' head," convictions in both of these cases is quite possible. Therefore, strong defense cases must be established to provide a good basis for appeal, Money is needed now for reproduction of motion picture film, gathering of evidence, repayment of bail moneys, publicity costs, etc. - if these defendants are not to waste their time in jail. We can't do it alone, we need your help. Some of the specific ways you can help are:

Dear Friends,

As the overside indicates, our chairman Walter Teague and one of our most dedicated young staff-workers Mike Gimbel, were temporarily taken from our sides in the struggle to bring the message of Vietnamese-American friendship to the people.

The seriousness of these police-state, frame-up attempts is indicated in the nature of the charges and the amounts of the bail. There have been many previous attacks on the committee and its members: 10 illegal arrests - all of which we have won in the courts - and interference with our street activities, to the violent action of breaking-in and vandalizing our office and terrorizing our staff. All of these attacks have been illegal and executed without warrant or pretext. The New York Civil Liberties Union, on our behalf, is working on a suit against the New York Police department for harassment, false arrest and denial of civil rights.

COMPARED WITH ALL PREVIOUS ATTACKS, THE NEW ARRESTS REPRESENT A SERIOUS ATTEMPT BY THE POLICE TO DESTROY OUR COMMITTEE!

The police hope to end our activities by these attempts to frame our leading activists and deny us their energies and dedication - at the same time exhausting our financial resources in legal expenses.

OUR ONLY HOPE OF SURVIVAL IN CARRYING ON OUR WORK DEPENDS ON THE COMMITMENT AND SUPPORT WE RECEIVE FROM FRIENDS SUCH AS YOURSELVES!

We need, first and foremost FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS for the legal expenses and bails. We still have not come close to recovering from the tremendous costs of our efforts in the October 21 Pentagon Confrontation (At which we distributed 15,000 copies of the NLF's new Political Program, as well as organizing and leading the initial wave of the protest march on the Pentagon itself.) Additional expenses of greater - than - usual magnitudes have been required in subsequent demonstrations as the tempo and militance of the anti-war movement climbed to their current peak.

In the Rusk-Foreign Policy Association (Nov. 14) and the Stop The Draft Week (Dec. 6-8) demonstrations, we pioneered - almost entirely by ourselves at the outset - the use of defense-wear for demonstrators -- helmets, gas masks, etc. -- and the use of mobile street tactics to evade the trap of mass illegal arrests to which the demonstrators have become increasingly prone.

IN THE S.T.D.W. EVERY COMMITTEE STAFF MEMBER WAS EITHER HOSPITALIZED OR SINGLED OUT BY THE COPS AND ARRESTED!

The arrests of Walter and Mike, with their ensuing legal battles, threaten the committee with exhaustion of many-times its resources. So we must now issue a general appeal to friends and the general public alike, to do all you can to help us in mobilizing support to: STOP THE POLICE FRAME-UPS, HELP THE TEAGUE & GIMBEL DEFENSE FUND AND FINALLY, THWART THE ATTEMPT TO DESTROY THE COMMITTEE!!

Our most crying needs, in order of severity, are as follows:

1. Contributions to the DEFENSE FUND.
2. CONTRIBUTIONS, or preferably ORDERS FOR LITERATURE AND FILMS to sustain the committee in its normal operations and to remove the extra back-debt.
3. In the New York City area, contributions of TIME AND EFFORT in our office work. As a result of increased street and demonstration efforts we have been receiving a host of mail asking about our work and activities - orders have not, unfortunately, shown a similar increase.)

## SOME NOTES ON OUR ACTIVITIES

Since we last wrote to you, our primary activities (aside from our main functions of literature and film sales and rentals) have been in the activist arena of street demonstrations.

An all out effort to mobilize our maximum resources for the Oct. 21 Pentagon Confrontation proved itself in political results with a major objective being substantially and visably advanced: the realization by increasing numbers of peace activists that our real enemy lies in Washington - and that the people of Hanoi, Haiphong, Long Binh and Dak To are our friends - that they are, in fact, our allies in our hopes, aspirations and struggles for a life of dignity and happiness free from oppression - for our own self-determination in America.

This realization was advanced in several ways. First, and to the great satisfaction of the committee staff, you made it possible by your contributions for Mr. Nguyen Van Luy to address the hundreds of thousands of peace demonstrators at the Lincoln Memorial Rally. Mr. Nguyen's message that "both the National Liberation Front in the South, and the defenders in the North stand firmer and more determined than ever to fight this war to a finish, to drive out all foreign troops, and to decide for themselves the future of Vietnam." was timely, and well-received by the thousands of militant, young activists who are increasingly seeking more meaningful ways and ideas to stop the war than are currently provided by the top-heavy establishment peace institutions. (Inasmuch as Mr. Nguyen's speech was rudely interrupted by Mobilization leaders and he was not allowed to complete it, we are enclosing the full text. We are sure you will agree with our very high estimate of it.)

Secondly, we were successful in pressuring the "leadership" into allocating an entire major section of the Rally-March (section D) to those who wished to show their solidarity and support for their brave Vietnamese brothers and sisters fighting for liberation in the NLF and the DRV! This was a difficult accomplishment in the face of the "Negotiationist" position of the conservative leadership. It was this section, "The Vietnamese Contingent" that Mr. Nguyen jubilantly welcomed after his speech, and amid the theme of "Victory for the Vietnamese" helped us in the completion of a third, resounding success; the distribution of 15,000 copies of the latest issue of "Vietnam Courier" containing the full text of the new Political Program of the NLF-SV.

Every activist should know that this very liberal new program is a serious effort by the NLF to provide an "out" for Johnson and dignified basis for an end to the war. It has been endorsed as such by the Knight newspaper chain, third largest in this country. (SEE THE SPECIAL BULK OFFER FOR THE PROGRAM ON THE FOLLOWING PAGE.)

Mr. Nguyen and Walter Teague then led the section with its NLF banners in a circling maneuver to the SDS section, successfully precipitating the March on the Pentagon, which the "leadership" was trying to stall out of existence! Mr. Nguyen's visit was important in many ways, to us all and particularly to his fellow Vietnamese-Americans.

Our West coast friends may have the additional pleasure of tasting the succulent Vietnamese cookery of Nguyen's own hand, for he is a professional chef and cooks for the National Guardian dinners in San Francisco! Again, many - many thanks for making it all possible!

On Nov. 14 we took part in a demonstration called by SDS (later co-opted by the Parade Committee "leaders" when it became known that Rusk would appear) to protest the anniversary dinner of the corporate controlled high-policy-making Foreign Policy Ass. at the Hilton Hotel. Thousands of demonstrators turned out, and following the lead of militants, including USCANLF-SV personnel, avoided the trap of police barricades which attempted to block them off in isolated areas where hundreds of Mounted and crack Tactical Police were without having been given any pretext by the "legally" assembled, already brutally assaulting several hundred who had followed the "leadership" into the areas ordered by the cops. The demonstrators surged through the streets for hours in separate mobile groups, tying up midtown traffic and continually keeping the pursuing police totally disorganized, frequently trapping isolated groups of cops themselves. The police's attempt to deny the protesters their right to picket, combined with the refusal of the masses of demonstrators

to be fooled by the "leaders" ( a lesson learned at the Pentagon ), led to the largest most disruptive and successful demonstration in this city so far.

In the Stop the Draft Week demonstrations (Dec. 6-8) the Parade Committee leadership, wearing the hats of the STDW committee, completely threw aside the overwhelming consensus of militant youth expressed at a series of meetings that week, and each day called thousands of demonstrators into a huge police trap at Battery Park on the pretext of "closing down" the Whitehall street induction center. Later they openly admitted they had no hope that they could close down the well-guarded center, but were afraid of losing control of the demonstrations as on Nov. 14.

Literally thousands of plainclothes cops infiltrated the demonstrators ranks and arrested militant leaders on sight before they could effectively initiate tactics to pull the demonstrators out of the barricaded traps. Time and again plainclothes cops took control of the parading demonstrators and led hundreds at a time into isolated traps where they were cut off from any escape and then brutally attacked, beaten and arrested in mass. Many of the arrests were later dropped due to their blatant illegality.

The main result of the demonstrations was a significant increase of understanding by large groups of previously "pacifist-oriented" activists, of the sell-out nature of the official leadership.

Calls for formation of a new anti-Imperialist resistance coalition outside the Parade Committee have been made by most militants and USCANLF-SV and other leading groups have already begun formations of the new coalition, whose emphasis will be to point up the imperialist nature of the war, show solidarity with the Vietnamese, Afro-american and all other liberation struggles in the world.

Strategically, it will function outside the establishment and place demands on the government rather than engage in the self-defeating negotiations with police that are the hallmark of the Parade Committee's "leaders." Mobile tactics will be further explored, but emphasis will be on political goals, without which no tactics can long survive.

Thank you, Mr. Chairman.  
Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am very grateful to the organizers of this demonstration for giving me this privilege of coming here today to express my thoughts, and to bring you some true facts about the war of genocide which is still raging in my homeland.

My dear American friends, as you all know, the recent flowery speeches of President Johnson and his underlings are nothing new, and have resulted in the war of aggression in Vietnam becoming fiercer than ever. More Vietnamese villages have been destroyed; more women, children and other innocent civilians have been killed; more tons of bombs have fallen on both the North and the South of Vietnam, meanwhile our President and his flunkies are mouthing words of peace.

Nevertheless, both the National Liberation Front in the South, and the defenders in the North stand firmer and more determined than ever to fight this war to a finish, to drive out all foreign troops, and to decide for themselves the future of Vietnam, their fatherland. President Johnson has boasted, according to James Reston in the San Francisco Chronicle, that: "I am not going to be the first President of the United States to lose a war," But every loyal Vietnamese believes, and as a Vietnamese-American, I believe, that he will, in the not too distant future, be forced to eat those words; and that the government he heads (if he does head it much longer) will be forced to recognize Vietnam as a free, independent and sovereign nation.

In the North, the bombs continue to fall, but the people stand upright, and in spite of 32 months of ceaseless bombardment, life goes on; Education has been expanded; in scattered factories, output has increased; and food production is greater than ever before.

In the South, the National Liberation Front met in a special congress during August of this year and adopted a political program to step up the war of liberation, and to prepare to establish a provisional government based on an extremely liberal statement of policy to give every Vietnamese a fair share in the freedom and prosperity that will be theirs, when they have won their independence. Representatives of the Front are putting these policies into practice as best they can

under war conditions throughout the liberated areas, which is about 80 percent of South Vietnam and includes about two-thirds of the people.

Meanwhile the struggle goes on; while the caterpillars of the U. S. tanks crush fields and villages in the South of Vietnam, and while Washington's militarist flunkies in Saigon, (who style themselves disciples of Hitler), fight over the farcical "election" to a "presidency" of a puppet government, large numbers of patriotic workers and intellectuals in the towns and cities are thrown into jails and concentration camps, simply because they want Independence, Freedom and Peace.

The administration of the United States and the handful of traitors in Saigon have, for thirteen years, violated the fundamental principles of the 1954 Geneva Agreements on Vietnam, and brutally trampled on the sacred aspirations of all the people of Vietnam, as well as the ideals of justice and humanity of the whole of progressive mankind. But for all that, and in spite of the agonizing pain of napalm, the destruction of villages and of vast stretches of their fields and forests, the "pacification" which is only a fancy name for subjugation -- in spite of all the terrible suffering caused by this genocidal war which, in the eyes of the Vietnamese people as a whole, makes "United States" equal to aggression, violence, and murder; these same people of Vietnam have no hatred for the people of the United States.

The Vietnamese fighters for democracy and freedom and for national salvation welcome the rising protests of the peace forces in this country and look upon demonstrations such as we have here today as their second line of defence. I am very happy to be here to participate with you in your resolute and widespread struggle to oppose and to bring to a speedy end our government's illegal, immoral and unjust war in Vietnam. Honest Americans from all walks of life who march in our nation's capitol today, are concerned about the good name and the basic interests of the United States of America, our children's future, and the right of all peoples to self-determination, and world peace.

THEREFORE, WE HERE ASSEMBLED, DEMAND:

\*\*\* STOP THE U.S. WAR OF AGGRESSION IN VIETNAM!

\*\*\* STOP PERMANENTLY AND UNCONDITIONALLY U.S. BOMBING AND ALL OTHER ACTS OF WAR AGAINST THE VIETNAMESE PEOPLE!

\*\*\* WITHDRAW ALL U.S. TROOPS FROM SOUTH VIETNAM!

WHEREAS: There exists a worldwide struggle against U. S. Imperialism,

WHEREAS: The worldwide movement against war, racism and imperialism is one,

WHEREAS: S. D. S. is a part of this struggle and must communicate with and relate to it,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

There be established an administrative position at the national level of S.D.S. to be called the S.D.S. National Coordinator for Liason with Revolutionary and Liberation Movements and Organizations.

This position consist of one full-time coordinator on minimum subsistence salary working out of the National Office.

Additional personnel and assistance may be sought - if available.

This position be filled by majority vote at this conference if qualified nominations are presented and accepted or by appointment by the National Interim Committee no later than Feb. 1st, 1968.

In the event of resignation from this position, the N.I.C. will make a new appointment within 30 days unless there is to be a National Convention within 30 days of the resignation in which case the following would apply;

That this office is to be filled by election by majority vote at each annual convention.

This position have the following duties and responsibilities;

To establish contacts for S. D. S. with Revolutionary and Liberation Movements and Organizations here in the U. S. and abroad.

To solicit statements of support for and position papers, information reports and other relevant information from these groups.

To solicit specific requests from these groups for needed aid and assistance.

To offer to these groups information on aid and assistance agreed upon by members of S. D. S.

To, begining with the issue of New Left Notes that comes out two weeks following taking of office, publish a weekly reportage of activities and information obtained, in New Left Notes.

To include in this report the following;

1. Non-confidential names and addresses of organizations contacted.
2. Statements and reports from these groups.
3. Requests from these groups.
4. Information on acts of repression against these groups and individuals concerned, including information on defense needs.
5. Types of training and skills needed to prepare individuals for eventual work with these groups.
6. Generally, to providing information to local S. D. S. chapters on activities of these groups in their areas.



To prepare for a conference between S. D. S. representatives and Revolutionary and Liberation Movements and Organizations at home and abroad, to be held in the near future.

To seek and assist in the obtaining of recruiters and representatives from Revolutionary and Liberation Movements and Organizations to appear on-campus and before S. D. S. local Chapters.

To assist in contacts between S. D. S. local chapters and Revolutionary and Liberation Movements and Organizations.

We, the members of the workshop on Liberation movements and oppressed people and supporters of this resolution believe that this resolution should be adopted in the interests of building solidarity in the Anti-Imperialist Movement and in the interests of making S. D. S. relevant to this world movement.

PEASANTS IN RICE-FIELD:

COMMENTARY TO THE DOCUMENTARY: "OUR CHILDREN ACCUSE"

1. In Vietnam it is a sign of mourning to wear a white turban.

The girl whom you see beside the Minister of National Education is relating to the journalistes of several countries the greatest mishap to her life. Her school was razed to the ground by American bombs. Here is all that was left of it.

2. It happened on February 9th, 1966 at HUONG PHUC, a remote village in a mountainous region of North Vietnam with no military target. On that day, as usual, the children of HUONG PHUC went to school. Hardly had the class commenced, when bombs and rockets rained down. In less than one minute 33 boys and girls were killed and 24 others wounded. One more crime by the U.S. Air Force.
3. But this is not the single case. Many schools in Quang Binh, Vinh Linh, Thanh Hoa, Phat Dien, Nam Dinh and so many other provinces and localities of North Vietnam have also been targets of U.S. aircraft, and many teachers and pupils have been massacred.
4. In South Vietnam the first victims of B-52's, of phosphorus and napalm bombs, of the spraying of poison gas and noxious chemicals are children, too.
5. Hospitals for children and maternities are not spared either.
6. A kindergarden devastated, children burnt by napalm or mutilated for the rest of their lives, orphans wandering among the ruins of their houses, and everywhere in the graveyards, small tombs recall that U.S. planes have passed, murdering children, slaying mothers and sowing mourning to families.
7. By massacring our children, Washington aims at forcing the Vietnamese people to bend their knees. It is mistaken! We will avenge all our dead, and all our children.

In the USA itself, the demonstrators shout: "Johnson, how many kids did you kill today?" Johnson, McNamara, Dean Rusk will go down in history as the worst slaughterers of children in our epoch. They will gain nothing by their massacres but only shame, contempt and hatred from the world people.

8. They are eight, ten and twelve years old, they are full of vitality, radiant with joy. But here they are, for ever and ever gone off. Their houses will be unoccupied. Their school is razed. What word can express all the sufferings of the parents, and all of our hatred?

Come with us to this land of victories, the land where more than one-hundred U.S. piratical planes of all kinds have been downed.

People looking at photos:

The citizens of the city of Vinh, like any other person of the province of An, consider the task of fighting the U.S. for national salvation, their sacred duty.

Everybody, the driver, the worker and the soldier, all have a calm mind and a strong determination to produce well--and to fight well.

Top of tower:

"U.S. piratical planes, come here again and you'll see how a network of blazing fire will be woven by the factories and the villages here!"

Faces of gunners:

That network of fire will burn into ashes all U.S. hawks that dirty the sky over Nghe An, the Hong Linh mountain and the Lam river.

Bundles of newspapers:

What new information has been received this morning that makes the brothers and sisters of the post office busier than any other morning?

Newspaper "Nam Dan":

The U.S. has committed another crime on the soil of our dear land!

Insurance sign to hospital:

In the successive days of fierce fighting against U.S. planes, Vinh hospital still keeps up its work. The physicians and the doctors here must witness much suffering. Many old men and women, and many mothers and children have been killed by U.S. bombs and shells.

Doctor looking at paper:

We must save little Thuan at any cost! Phan Van Thuan, a young pioneer of Vinh city, is a deserving brother of the martyrs: Kim Dong and Ly Tu Trong. He's so eager to fight that he persisted in being in the battlefield to carry ammunition to the artillerymen.

Injured child:

The crazied U.S. wants to kill our young children. Let's stay their bloody hands!

Infant (read quickly!):

A small citizen has been given birth to during the battle against the brutal U.S. aircraft.

Keep your mind at peace, mother of the child! Your child will grow up together with the victory of our whole nation.

((Small child standing in shadows))

This is Nghin Dan, where the crimes the U.S. committed will always be remembered. The once small and attractive hamlet of Long on the bank of the Hieu river has been razed to the ground.

I know that you're going looking for your father, little child, but nowhere will you find him now! Never will we be able to tell all about the crimes committed by the cruel U.S. enemy! In this one bomb crater alone, all the members of the Pham Thi Hoa family have been buried--only she survived. She can't sit idly by now. She has turned suffering into hatred and determination, and has voluntarily written a letter asking to be admitted into the militiamen's ranks.



Rifles firing:

Her first bullets will contribute to bring down the U.S. planes and will avenge her dear relatives and villagers.

Trucks passing fast

Now, the U.S. planes are coming! The workers and peasants immediately take up their weapons.

Newspaper clipping

Our blood debt must be paid!

People climbing on truck

Every factory, every hamlet on this heroic land of traditional political power is a bastion always ready to fight.

Linemen working on pole

Communications must always be maintained. Even though they may pay with their lives, these linemen persist in their duty.

Guns firing, jet engine flaming.

How brave must the riflemen be who fight persistently alongside the artillery - together to destroy the enemy. The whole city of Vinh and the whole heroic Nghe An province have risen up to make the bandits pay for their crimes!

Cannon firing at U.S. plane, Aircraft crashing:

This has been the fate of more than 100 modern U.S. planes already downed to date on the soil of Nghe An, including the 100th, 300th and 500th U.S. plane downed in the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. As long as the U.S. enemy persists in their adventures, they will have to suffer more shameful defeats.

People crossing bridge: (read quickly)

Now we would like you to come and see with us the agricultural cooperative Ba To. This cooperative has proved to be worthy of its title meaning "Brotherhood between Nghe An and Quang Ngai in the work of fighting the US for national salvation." Most of its young men have gone to the front, leaving behind heavy responsibilities for the able women to shoulder. Comrade Cao Luc, an agricultural hero and the coop-manager, is entrusting the women with their heavy responsibilities. Mr. Khanh, sub-manager of the coop in charge of cattle breeding and Mr. Tran another sub-manager of the coop in charge of farming techniques and other women firmly believe that they will fulfill all of their production and fighting duties whatever the situation.

Girl with buffalo struggling to control plow: (read quickly)

How difficult to manage is her first furrow, but it is also very encouraging! It's certain that this crop, grown in defiance of U.S. attack, will be abundant with heavy golden ears of rice under the girls' care. Considering the ricefield their battle-field and they themselves fighters, the peasant girls are contributing their shares in defeating the enemy right at their working place.

In defiance of all the air-raids by the US, pig raising is still steadily carried out here. Thanks to good care, more than 200 pigs have put on much weight.

Threshing Machine

"Have your mind at ease when you go to the front, we will do well all the jobs you've entrusted us with".

Putting rice into sacks

The abundant tender love and care of the people at the rear will be brought to the front, together with this white rice.

Child (read 2nd paragraph quickly)

"Behave yourself, little child, so I'll love you even more your father has gone to the Front to defeat the enemy for you".

"At this time of the day, I think, he is ready at his artillery piece or is firing at the enemy. Keep your mind at peace at the front, dear. Down as many US planes as you can while at home, we fulfill our duty".

View down beach

Years ago, Quynh Thuan had been quite famous for its salt. Today the members of the salt coop of Quynh Thuan have proved themselves to be worthy of their title, inspired by their fighting spirit against the U.S.

Water through sluice:

They have not only enlarged the salt field to 80 hectares but have also increased their output rapidly.

Determined to defeat the US enemy, they have worked untiringly in the scorching sun of 38° - 40° centigrade and have reached an unprecedented productivity of 400 longtons a day.

Thanks to their industriousness, salt will be sent up to the mountains, to the Front and to every part of our country, thus contributing their share to build up the country and to defeat the enemy.

Men with plan:

On the soil of Quynh Luu, conservation construction site "February 3rd" is speeding up its activities under the attack.

In the past, there were many calamities here: drought and flood... but the only thing the ruling circles would do was to sit idly by.

It's not accidental that thousands of conservation workers here were of one mind that the Party's birth-day should be used to name their construction-site.

Tractor pushing rocks:

The heavy weight of rocks imposing upon the soil here had to give in before men's power. 9,000 cubic meters of rock is a great amount, yet they have been carried away by buffalo-drawn carts. The people here didn't sit idly waiting for the machines and lorries to come. Just past half of the time scheduled, 93% of the rock has been extracted and carried away.

Now we would like you to go with us for a visit to a fishing area of the Fatherland, to those who brave the wind and the sun all year round. Girls standing with guns

Though endangered by the US piratical planes, the coop members of Dai Lien still work daily on the sea.

Fishermen on boat

As they must daily come face to face with US planes, they are always ready to fight. They take their fishing nets in onehand and their rifles in the other and are determined to get the highest output of fish in any situation. The days when the fishermen were permitted by the ruling class to go not more than two kilometers off the coastal line have gone forever.

### CUES:

Prologue (read during singing)

The North West, theatre of historic fighting years ago and witness of so many glorious victories of the Vietnamese people and Army over the French colonialists.

Since its liberation, that jewel of the western part of Vietnam has made big strides forward to a new and better life. Together with the people's army men and those coming from the delta to reclaim virgin land, the North West people are enthusiastically working to put a new face on this forest and mountainous region.

State farms, factories, new centres spring up with their numerous red-roofed buildings. The area of reclaimed land keeps on extending and poverty and famine are now things of the past. Therefore it contributes to the common cause of the entire nation in the drive to advance speedily, powerfully and steadily to socialism.

Bombshelling, smoke and fire: (read quickly)

Since August 5th, 1964, however, the U.S. pirates have madly sent their planes and warships to attack North Vietnam. Starting with Vinh Linh and Quang Binh, north of the seventeenth parallel, the enemy "escalated" higher and higher into the territory of the Democratic Republic of Vietnam.

On June 14th, 1965, the shots against U.S. planes were first heard at Noc Chau. Ever since, the air war has extended to the peaceful and picturesque North West.

(Bird's eye view of Son La) Son La, the administrative centre of the North West with its imposing buildings, fruit of these last few years hard work, is now a heap of bricks and tiles with craters left by U.S. bombs.

(Dien Bien Phu market place) These villages with picturesque names such as Ban Co, Ban Giang, Ban Lau, Kuong La, Him Lam, Chieng Ly..... bear deep hatred for U. S. barbarous attacks.

(Fighters faces burning with anger and hatred) Animated with their traditional and high spirit of indomitable fighting, the national minorities of the North-west will never allow themselves to be intimidated by those coward U.S. bombings. With the weapons they have, the young and the old, men and women, all united as one man, stand up to fire at U.S. planes and to capture U.S. pilots.

Whenever and wherever they come, the U.S. planes can be sure that they always have to face the Thai, the Meo, the Huong, the Xa, the Ha Nhi, the Dao etc... united and resolute to bring them down.

(The rifle-group over De Castries' P.C.) Every corner of the Dien Bien Land has its glory. This Him Lam hill, witnessing the opening of the Dien Bien Phu campaign, now bearing the name of hero Phan Dinh Giot, the fighter who used his body to stop the loophole, this is A.1 hill, the terrain on which our fighters and the French soldiers disputed inch by inch round the clock for 36 days and nights. This is the place where tanks were fought at Muong Thanh and this is the place where tanks were fought at Muong Thanh and this is De Castries' P.C.

All those glorious and sacred places are instilling our people in their fight against U.S. planes.



(The rifle-group of a State Bank branch) The State Bank branch, the chemist's shop, the post-office, the general department store etc...are not merely the flowers of socialism, they also constitute a thick fire network to catch the Yankee vultures.

(The machine-gun group with fighters using their shoulders as support) This is Muong Fon, the native land of hero Be Ban Dan who used his shoulders as support for his friend's machine-gun in the last resistance. It is also here that his example is most closely followed. There are families with four kids taking turn to carry shells to anti-aircraft units under enemy heavy bombing and strafing.

Carrying guns, going up hill Formerly roads were open through mountains to pull the guns up to their positions around Dien Bien Phu, to fight against the French colonialists. At present, the sons and daughters of the North West with their traditional mighty limbs and indomitable will, pull the guns up on the mountains to fire at U.S. planes. The hard roads they pulled the guns through led to victory. Now the road to carry the guns up is no less arduous and no doubt will take them to victory.

U.S. planes-Guns-Gunners busy manoeuvring (man with sighting device) We are high up on a mountain. The sky and clouds are around us, ricefields down below. We are determined to intercept and bring down those U.S. ganster's planes flown in from Laos and Thailand.

(Planes roaring - Guns thundering - Bombs blasting) Moc Chau, Son La, Dien Bien, then Lai Chau, Nghia Lo...the region as a whole stands up to fiercely fight back. Twelve years ago, the North West brought down 62 French planes in the Dien Bien Phu campaign, Now, 15 U.S. planes have already been downed, after the first 16 days of fighting.

The capture of U.S. pilots Right from their first incursion on June 14th, 1965, U.S. planes were shot down on the spot and a pilot, Lawrence Guarino, was captured. In the days that followed many of Guarino's colleagues who ventured to violate the North West sky, had to share the same lot.

(A Meo girl carrying a U.S. pilot-helmet Debris of U.S. planes) Tons of modern U.S. jets take turn in exhibiting their carcasses on the mountains of the North West. The North West used to be known as a haunted place, that is under feudalism and colonialism. Socialism has liberated it and freed it from all devils. It is quite understandable that those U.S. "Phantoms", "Skyraiders", "Thunderchiefs". .. can't expect the people to entertain a love for them.

Award-day/On July 12, the North-West military zone solemnly celebrated the reception of President Ho Chi Minh's award of the "Determined to defeat the U.S. aggressors" flag. Comrade Le Quang Ba, member of the Vietnam Workers' party Central Committee, Chairman of the Central Committee of the Nationalities, acted on behalf of the Party and Government to hand over the award.

Flag with writing Up to August 28th, the day the total number of U.S. planes shot down in North Vietnam reached 500, 26 were accounted for the North West alone. Son La ranks sixth among the provinces with best fighting records and was awarded the "Independence" Order second class.

Flags awarded to the Youth Branch in Battlefield At many anti-aircraft units composed entirely of minority people, many young fighters were admitted to the Labour Youth Union right at the fighting post.

Relaxation at the battle-field After tense and hard days of fighting come the easy hours of relaxation between the people and army men by the gun site.

Clouds - The engineers building roads After moments of hard fighting, life starts anew with its usual animation. Destroyed roads are being rebuilt and new ones opened up. Once again, the North-West sends to the delta its forest and mining products and gets manufactured goods in return.

Spindle Once again, the pleasing sound of spindles is heard at the Thai villages back to their peaceful atmosphere. In the immense ricefields of Dã n Bien Phu, Quang Huy, Nghia Lo... minority women begin their work at the sound of the coop bell.

Women picking At a Moc Chau farm, groups of woman-workers are seen among green scrubs picking tea leaves. Here is vast grassland, so good for cattle breeding. Here sheep are sheared and their hair sent to the Haiphong wool factory.

Women on horse When comes Market Day, the state general department store regains its beehive activity.

Gun site - Clearing the shells At the anti-aircraft units, getting ready for combat is a matter of routine, high vigilance is something that can't be slackened especially in the North West which inherits the renown of being the enemy's burial ground. Formerly, answering the Party's call on the occasion of great military campaigns, the minority left their highland to join the army, to work as army carriers or to increase production at home and make good contributions to the people's army.

(Mending shirts - Offering prunes to the army men) The tradition is carried on: the people and army shoulder to shoulder fighting against the U.S. aggressors and carry out production at the same time. High revolutionary spirit and confidence prevail everywhere.

(To Hieu peach tree. A peach garden. Mountains and hills covered with clouds) Like the To Hieu peach tree, Son La is all the brighter and more youthful in its revolutionary drive. Through fire, the North-West is comparable to a diamond which through skilled cutting and polishing has more than doubled its worth, and continues to glitter in the midst of the nation.



## COMMENTARY

### "DAYS WITH THE YOUTH SHOCK BRIGADES"

#### Introduction.

This film was not made for Americans. It is intended for Vietnamese mothers whose sons have given up their universities and professional training and volunteered to serve in the Youth Shock Brigades in order to repair the damage done by U.S. bombers.

(Crowd at the station...a young girl putting on her cap.)

This is only one among thousands of pictures of the younger generation that we--the film makers--have recorded in the upsurge of our entire nation against the United States.

We want to tell you about these ordinary youths of various social positions: teachers, students, Vietnamese residents just back from foreign countries and Chinese residence ..

All have answered to the call of the Party and the Labor Youth Union to join the Youth Shock Brigades to fight against the U.S. for national salvation.

(Mother seeing her son off...a young couple.)

They are mothers, fathers, husbands and wives; they have no hesitation to sacrifice everything for the sake of their dear relatives who are front to perform great efforts.

(Young girls sitting singing...a youth speaking.)

Fighting the U.S. for national salvation is the duty of all our nation, not anyone in particular. We know very well that you've put aside your dream to go through universities and professional schools and only want to realize this once the country has been reunified.

(Panorama of mountains and forests.)

To defeat the enemy...to safeguard the fertile land handed down to us by our forefathers...is the tradition of our heroic nation that our younger generation today is adhering to.

(A group in discussion.)

What are you thinking about now, dear young friends, just a few hours before the fatherland entrusts you with new missions.

(Company girl sub-commander...youths shaking hands showing their determination.)

Yesterday the U.S. pirate planes sabotaged our roads and bridges to hinder the fight of our nation. But things are not what they've thought about. To you, youths who have heroic traditions of the August Revolution, will come no discouragement. It's certain that you will be able to make even more solid bridges and better roads through whatever dangers and difficulties there may be.

(Making a railway line in a storm.)

Difficulties and hardships are not just these...but in the fight against the U.S. for national salvation victories will always be ours if we know how to take advantage of opportunity, time, and situation.



(Truck driving along muddy road.)

What truck is running during this dangerous time of day?

(Wheel turning around and around.)

An unexpected thing has happened.

(Driver meeting the leader of the youths.)

That's nothing--you've got your friends to help you!

(Truck driving away to the cheers of youths.)

Life itself never excludes these exceptional events. Be calm, dear comrade driver. It's certain that you'll get to the front on time.

(Digging trenches.)

Time is very precious for the fighters of shock brigades. Experience has shown that to win victories there must first be good preparation.

(Army men helping the shock brigades at drill.)

How can they help feeling embarrassed when they have just left their schools? But this will soon be forgotten and they'll learn to shoot down planes just as the soldiers have done.

(A nun cleaning her rifle.)

We know very well how this nun, Dam Thi Dan, answers to the sacred call of the fatherland to take up arms after years of reciting sutras and rattling the prayer rattle...The same hands, but they act quite differently now.

(A youth taking aim...firing...a model plane destroyed.)

Take aim carefully, dear young man!...The U.S. aggressors must pay for their crimes.

(Receiving letters.)

These feet of film are reserved for the youths' parents, the ones who are following their sons and daughters' every step.

(A young girl getting cross.)

Don't be cross anymore, young friend, for the letter from your family has come.

(A girl sifting rice by her foster mother...a girl stirring rice.)

If the girl's parents have a chance to see this picture now they would be quite happy and at peace, for their daughter is living in the love and care of the people...The girl is quite grown up now, not just a pupil of the 7th form as when she was at home.

(A girl writing a letter.)

Go on writing, dear friend, to tell your relatives about the road you've covered and the great school you've voluntarily joined.



(Sticking an article onto the wall newspaper.)

This is the way you're attending your simple but great school.

(A girl writing her letter...printing newspapers.)

As you're living and working with the spirit of the youth shock brigades, you're fulfilling the task the Party and the Labor Youth Union have entrusted you in the fight face-to-face with the enemy and on the ideological front as well.

(A girl sitting, studying...a teacher giving a lesson.)

Do you think that this is just an ordinary class? Seeing you and the teacher here we understand that given our present situation we must not only defeat the enemy in the fields of production and in fighting--but in the cultural field as well, in order to bring them to a complete failure. And tomorrow, when the U.S. aggressors are all wiped out and the country reunified, you will be able to enjoy full rights and have enough power and capability to build up the country whatever position you'll be in.

(An evening course.)

Though the light you have here in this class is not an electric one, you have already got the bright light of the communist ideal which shows you the way.

(Repairing a road at night...repairing a railway line.)

Through these few feet of film we want to show you how we are realizing our communist ideal in repairing some part of a highway...and now, part of a railway line which has just been destroyed by the enemy.

(A youth with an oil-lamp in hand.)

Those who are enjoying the fruits of the youth shock brigades tonight will not only have profound impressions to take with them on the long journey to the front--but they will also take pride in the power of youth who are fighting against the U.S.

(Making a road.)

Tomorrow, if the history of this road is written, the most important thing to be recorded is the role of the shock brigades, those who have proven to the U.S. that it is futile to hope to impair the struggle of our nation by sabotaging our lines of communication.

(Repairing a road with tools and inclined planes.)

To repair roads and railways against the U.S. the shock brigade fighters work not only with their youthful enthusiasm but with their intelligence as well.

(Alert.)

Youths are not only good at working but they are good at fighting too. At the place where we fight face-to-face with the enemy daily, nothing we've seen here is strange to us.

(Sky.)

Some minutes of practice ready to destroy the enemy.

(Some youths come up from downstream.)

And then working energetically to score even greater achievements.

(Trucks start moving.)

Thank you, young friends. You've enabled us to ride on in the shortest period of time.

(Singing.)

Young friends, sing to your hearts' content to welcome your victories and those of the entire nation.

(Road completed.)

Thank you, friends, for your great efforts...but that's just the beginning. More important is the coming hours and the future of those on their way to the front.

(Shock brigades marching.)

Goodbye, young friends! We are sorry not to be able to continue the way with you--the way we know in advance which will provide you with many more difficulties and hardships. But through the days we've lived with you and through the work you've done we're sure that you'll overcome all of these to contribute your share in the work of defeating the U.S. for national salvation.

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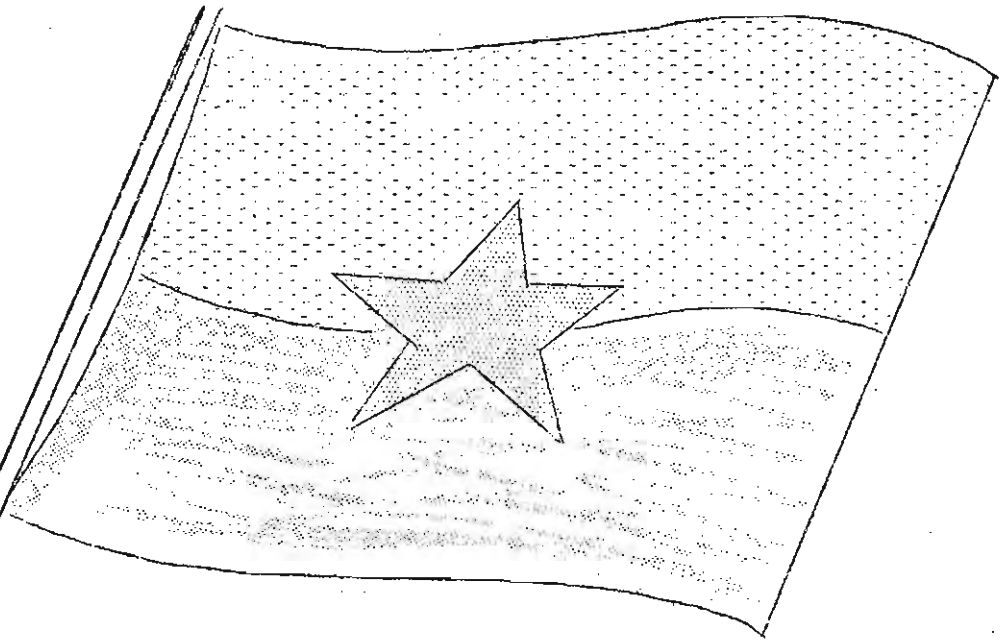
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

## VIETNAM, LAND OF FIRE

1.

Filed on the battlefields of South Vietnam and the D. R. V. (North Vietnam), "Land of Fire" deals with the reciprocal nature of the war. The struggle of the poorly armed Vietnamese and the anti-aircraft ground crews of the D. R. V. is shown to be a response to the armed invasion of the technologically superior United States forces, their massacre of the civilian population, the use of gas and toxic chemicals, the bombings of schools and leprosoria.

## DAYS WITH THE YOUTH SHOCK BRIGADES

2.

The Youth Shock Brigades are groups of North Vietnamese students and young people who have volunteered to repair bridges, highways and railroad lines and undertake new construction projects while themselves being subject to air attack. The film is most concerned with communication (originally to the parents of these youngsters) the elan and morale of the young people engaged in these projects.

## NGUYEN VAN TROI WILL LIVE FOREVER

3.

Nguyen Van Troi, a young South Vietnamese electrician, is a national hero of Vietnam. He was executed in 1964 for his complicity in an unsuccessful attempt to mine a bridge over which Defense Secretary McNamara had planned to travel. During the months of imprisonment preceding his execution Van Troi became a symbol of national resistance throughout the Third World. In Venezuela, National Liberation Forces captured a U.S. Air Force attache - whom they released after securing American assurances that Van Troi's life would be spared. The film juxtaposes Nguyen Van Troi's work, his imprisonment, and death against the efforts of the Vietnamese people to develop a peaceful technology, to organize resistance to American intervention and to destroy those whom they regard as murderers of their wives and children. The film was completed shortly after Nguyen Van Troi's execution.

## HEROIC CON CO

4.

Con Co is a small island of the coast, just north of the 17th parallel.

"From here I can hear the youthfull laughter of our friends, ...I can see Dinh Kinh...the cook, running skillfully across bomb craters...in order to gather green vegetables, I can see Khang Duc...of the Engineer Corps, return to places filled with 'retarded-action' and 'anti-personnel' bombs,...I can see the trenches, damp with sweat, lengthening a little more each day. These are the silent exploits which have permitted us to keep this miniscule island after 300 days and nights of combat!" (from the soundtrack)

## NEWSREEL # 2

5.

The war - shooting down of U. S. aircraft and captured American pilots - the Lunar New Year festivities in the cities and at the front.

A brief, horrible survey of the maimed, burned, pain-wracked victims of American aerial bombardment.

"They are eight, ten and twelve years old, they are full of vitality, radiant with joy. But here they are, for ever and ever gone off. Their houses will be unoccupied. Their school is razed. What word can express all the sufferings of the parents, and all of our hatred?" (from the sound track)

Effective for fund raising, it is hard not to be moved by this film.

## TEN GIRLS OF NAI MOUNTAIN

7.

With most of the men at the front, the young women of Vietnam have had to take over the duties once performed by men. The young women are both lovely and brave - which they prove in their defence against U.S. aircraft.

## TOXIC CHEMICAL WARFARE IN SOUTH VIETNAM

8.

This film was one of the initial efforts of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam ("Viet Cong") photographers to document American usage of poison gas, chemical irritants, and crop destroyers at a time when the American government itself denied knowledge of C-B warfare. An NLF medical team makes its rounds of Villages in the Liberated Areas.

The long-term significance of this brief film is two-fold: (1) It will probably constitute the first of many documentaries dealing with CW during our lifetimes: (2) Given the ultimate American validation of the film's thesis (hedged though it may be by the adjectives "harmless" and "benevolent"), the film can be taken as an example of the value of documentary films.

## A VISIT TO THE HEROIC LAND OF N'GHE AN

9.

In this visit to the province of Nghe An, we are shown the major aspects of life today in the D.R.V., the cities, the hamlets, the farming cooperatives, the salt fields, conservation sites and fishing villages. A film obviously made by a people determined to defeat the U. S. efforts to destroy their hard won achievements.

## THE NORTH WEST, FIGHTING AGAINST THE U.S. AGGRESSORS.

10.

The "Montagnards" (minority peoples of the mountains) of North Vietnam are shown in this film, to have been successfully integrated into the socialist society of the D. R. V. Whereas there are still fierce antagonisms between the Saigon, lowland (Kinh) vietnamese and the "Montagnards" in the south of Vietnam - in the North they fight side-by-side. In the D.R.V.'s North West, the minority people have adopted modern methods of farming and fighting, but still retain their customs and identity. There is much beauty in this film, in the songs, landscape and the people.

Produced by the Democratic Republic of Vietnam Commission for investigation of U. S. War Crimes in Vietnam, all of the various horrible techniques of modern U. S. warfare are recorded in this film. This is not entertainment, nor is it meant to please. Here are the scenes of electric torture, bombing of schools, hospitals and churches and most horrible of all, the devastation of people caused by napalm and "anti-personnel" bombs. While there is some English commentary, most of this film is silent - the scenes speak for themselves.

## TIME OF THE LOCUST (USA FILM)

13.

Produced by the American Friends Service Committee, directed by Peter Gessner, this is a compact and impressionistic survey of U. S. operations in Vietnam. This film is in essence a study in counterpoint between, on the one hand, U.S. bombings, 'Viet Cong' defenses, and hitherto unreleased Japanese news footage of atrocities and -- on the other -- a sound track of L.B.J. speeches, percussion, and U. S. popular music.

A 32 minute, 16 millimeter, black and white, National Liberation Front film with English sound track.

An overall view of the war as seen by the South Vietnamese National Front of Liberation. This is the best film so far on the war in South Vietnam and the resistance of the people of South Vietnam to the U. S. aggression. Here is not the face of an "Enemy" but a people determined to free themselves and defend their land.

QUYNH LAP or THE LEPERS' ACCUSATION

A 10 minute, 16 millimeter, black and white, D.R.V. film with French sound track.

Quynh Lap Leper Hospital, housing over 2,000 lepers was bombed by U. S. aircraft from June 13th to 16th, 1965. In 15 separate attacks the Hospital was totally destroyed. Built in 1957 by the D.R.V. this leperesorium was able in its last four years to send home to usefull lives over 1,700 lepers. Easily spotted from the air as a hospital, the U.S. bombing was intended to compel the Vietnamese to "bend their knees and surrender," "But never will the Vietnamese bow down!"
