

PROTEST the Festival of the Vultures

What is a vulture? A vulture lives off death. It gets its nourishment from dying flesh!

And, similarly, at the same time that 500,000 American youth are stationed 10,000 miles away in Vietnam, millionaires and billionaires of the huge corporations that get richer while these GIs die are having a gala festival. They are holding their annual "Diamond Ball" to celebrate the profits that the war has made for them and what they hope is the safeguarding of their world-wide financial empire with the blood of our sons and brothers.

The ball is a "benefit" for the Institute of International Education which says of itself: "many corporations have benefited from the Institute's wide experience and counsel" as they "have expanded their direct foreign investments by 60% in a decade -- to \$40 billion at the end of 1963."

Who attends this ball?

Charles W. Engelhard - largest U.S. investor in South African slave labor diamond mines, largest slumlord in Newark, one of the largest contributors to the Democratic Party. Lyndon Johnson took him to Australia as an "advisor" after the death of Prime Minister Holt.

Roger Lewis -- President of General Dynamics -- major recipient of defense contracts -- profits shot up 30% with the '65-'66 escalation of the Vietnam war.

George D. Woods -- was President of the so-called "World" Bank -- main U.S. weapon for the financial penetration and domination of foreign countries and economies.

Gov. Nelson Rockefeller -- his family owns: Chase Manhattan Bank (heavy investor in South Africa); McDonnell-Douglas Aircraft (every one shot down makes his stock shoot up); RCA-NBC (electronics-radio-T.V.); Standard Oil (supplies fuel for the planes) (takes 1.6 million barrels a day from Mideast oil fields.)

Sen. John Sherman Cooper -- Kentucky 'dove' and loyal servant of the above monopolists.

Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey -- Johnson's best round-the-world war salesman.

BIG FIRMS GET RICHER WHILE GIs DIE

These same celebrating billionaires, who are making millions in profit off the production of war materials are also those responsible for the persecution of anti-war activists. Because the anti-war movement threatens their profits, they cannot tolerate the continued freedom of such men and women.

These billionaires have tremendous power. They own the Mass Media (T.V., radio, and newspapers) and control the Courts that are persecuting anti-war leaders such as Dr. Spock and the others. How We Won

Utilizing all our political resources we took the offensive by gathering public and organizational support for the demand that the police stay away and not interfere with our right to hold a public demonstration. We organized for maximum flexibility and mobility so that the police would have to confront us in situations most

difficult for them and not at a point of their own choosing, or under their complete control.

Under these circumstances, the liberal imperialist rulers of New York City had to decide whether to use a degree of force to stop the march that would show far too much of the iron fist beneath the silk glove, or let us go. This time, rather than reveal the true nature of their system, they backed down.

Fighting the Imperialist State

There are those who claim to be revolutionaries who first want to get a permit! But it is impossible to fight imperialism by agreement with its police. The disastrous experience of Stop the Draft Week in New York City which saw the Student Mobilization Committee leadership collaborate with the police and meet with the mayor continuously -- to the point of setting the exact perimeter of the demonstration -- showed that to rely on the good will of the police means to get clobbered anyway, but worse.

False Leaders

Of course the SMC conducted that demonstration under the banner of the mobile tactics that had been demanded by growing numbers of militant youth. But in such a way as to discredit those tactics. On the other hand, when real mobile tactics had been effectively used the previous month at the Rusk demonstration against the will of both the police and the Parade Committee marshalls, there was such a howl of "rowdies" and "storm-troopers" from the establishment press -- from conservative to liberal -- that these "leaders" tripped over themselves to publicly state that they would never again let demonstrators get "out of control."

Silence on Mid-East

The established "peace" leadership has proven its

fear of organizing for a decisive battle against this racist, imperialist, big-business run system.

They have refused even to have the movement take positions on imperialist involvement in other parts of the world when the ruling-class is lined up solid such as the U.S.-Israeli aggression against the Arab people. This proves their lack of independence from the liberal establishment.

Why a New Coalition

But at the same time there exists a growing number of youth who want to express their rebellion against the entire society. The CP-SWP-Pacifist Coalition (with their factional differences) wants to hold these youth in check. They want to go from Dissent to Resistance and back to dissent via the ballot box.

We want to provide an independent organizational form for this rebellion to turn it from individual to effective mass rebellion against the warmakers.

Goal 'To Win'

As Julius Lester says: "Perhaps it has never occurred to any of us that our goal, in fact, is to win, and anything that does not point toward that winning is irrelevant and immaterial."

Mayor Lindsay Talks Peace at Sheep Meadow -- Makes War on Anti-Imperialist Marchers

On direct orders from Lindsay's office, with the Mayor's top aides and top police officials observing the police brutally and illegally attacked the 700 demonstrators massed in Washington Square Park as the first of 3 squads began to legally march on the sidewalk.

Although over 100 arrests were made in an attempt to totally destroy the march, squad two was able to break out of the park, as shown in the pictures, and, avoid police concentrations while marching uptown against traffic to their destination.



Principle vs. Temporary, Immediate "Gain"

The definition of opportunism is the sacrifice of the long-range interest of the struggle for the sake of some supposed immediate gain.

On April 27, 1968, Mayor John "emergency laws" Lindsay of New York City spoke at the Central Park Sheep Meadow "peace fair" on the invitation of its organizers, the Vietnam Peace Parade Committee

and the Student Mobilization Committee.

The leadership of these organizations may have felt that his appearance, (as well as that of Senators McCarthy and Kennedy - who were invited but responded negatively) would help to build the size of the rally, afford protection from police attack of

which they were fearful, and, above all, prove their respectability to the population as well as the establishment.

But what Lindsay's highly publicized appearance certainly did do was increase the prestige of this imperialist "dove" in the minds of millions of war-weary people. And this is just what he and his big-business backers intended it to do.

Why?

Because the liberals intend to take over the leadership of our movement completely and turn it into a loyal oppositionist movement which will never break with the system and therefore will give in to the ruling class at all crucial points.

And this latest collaboration with Lindsay marks a new low point in the independence of the anti-war movement from those very forces which it has to oppose and lead the masses into opposition to if we expect to win.

Dellinger's Excuse

Dave Dellinger, Chrm. of the National Mobilization Committee and coordinator of the Parade Committee, said: "This is the first time that someone like the mayor was willing to put himself on the line at all. We must help give expression to the public's insistence on a total halt to all bombing, North and South, and on the withdrawal of all American troops from Vietnam. To this end, we welcome the support of Mayor Lindsay and all other public officials and private individuals who join in the opposition to the war."

An Answer

Julius Lester: "They would not be opposing the war if it were succeeding. It is the failure of the war which they are opposed to, and not the ends it was hoped the war would accomplish.

If the adult leaders of the antiwar movement think they can use the liberal opposition to the war for their own ends, they are mistaken. McCarthy and Kennedy have given the liberals new strength. Lindsay's presence at the April demonstration will only increase that strength. Coalitions between liberals (those who believe that solutions can be found within the framework of the system) and radicals (those who believe that the system cannot provide real solutions) are always dangerous for radicals, if the radicals do not represent the greater strength.

Ultimately there can be no coalition between conflicting ideologies."

SNCC Withdraws

The Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) explained its decision to withdraw by stating, in part: "The issue which must be fought on all fronts is the presence of U.S. interests in Vietnam, Southeast Asia, Latin America, Africa and the Black communities here. We can't help but wonder if Mayor Lindsay, as well as Senators McCarthy and Kennedy, would be opposed to the war if the U.S. were winning.... They seek an end to the war so that they might more easily explore other means of continuing to exploit and oppress the people of Vietnam and other colored peoples of the world.

With this rally the white antiwar movement shows its total irrelevance to Black people. The war in Vietnam can only be stopped by defeating the enemy as the North Vietnamese are doing. The white antiwar movement finds it much easier to collaborate with the enemy."

SNCC has reason to lack confidence in the ability of the present leadership of the anti-war movement to hold out against pressure from the right. Just last August H. Rap Brown accepted an invitation to speak at a Hiroshima Day rally in support of Dr. Howard Levy co-sponsored by the Parade Committee and the Medical Committee Against the War. After Brown was indicted for "inciting to riot" during the rebellion in Cambridge, Md., the Medical Committee withdrew the invitation and the leaders of the Parade Committee capitulated to this splitting and racist hysteria in the name of "unity."

MPI Statement

But when anti-imperialist organizations which are also members of the Parade Committee put up a vigorous fight against invitations to capitalist politicians they were overruled. Pedro Juan Rua speaking for the Puerto Rican Pro-Independence Movement (MPI) attacked "the policies of conciliation" of the Parade Committee and said: "No capitalist politician, companeros, is exempt from the crimes of imperialism. Anyone who holds the power to mobilize police and armed forces against Blacks and Puerto Ricans is a firm upholder of the imperialist system.... What they fear -- and the magnificent Vietnamese and Black people's struggle has forced some into this position -- is that a particular war may bring about a generalized crisis within the imperialist system itself."

Even the announcement by SNCC and others that they could not participate under these conditions, did not cause the Parade Committee leadership to withdraw their invitation to Lindsay in the name of unity with the oppressed Black people.

Of course, anti-imperialist elements within the Parade Committee had objected to the whole picnic-like nature of the "peace fair" even before the invitation to Lindsay, particularly the arranging of every detail with the police and the yielding to every one of their demands.

Therefore, they had planned an Anti-Imperialist Feeder March which would link up with the main rally in Central Park but whose purpose would be to conduct a march through the center of the city which would educate people as to the nature of imperialism, show support for the rebellions of Black America and the victory of the Vietnamese revolution, and above all not negotiate away all of our rights to demonstrate to the police.

But after the invitation to Lindsay, followed a few days later by his asking for and getting special "emergency powers" to help put down the Black rebellions, having a completely separate demonstration became a matter of principle. (A forgotten word.)

(The P.C. leaders felt so immune from police attack that when demonstrators in the sheep meadow were arrested during scuffles with pro-war hecklers or on an attempted march to Columbia they got to court and found themselves without legal or organizational help from the Parade Committee. The Coalition for an Anti-Imperialist March provided assistance to them.)

We Went Back



and We Won

The use of thousands of uniformed and plainclothes police and mass arrests by the Mayor's office to stop what was to a large extent an anti-Lindsay march was so blatant that it caused a reaction of shock and opposition. Determined to take advantage of the enemy being temporarily off balance and determined not to give up any of our rights, CoAim decided to go back to Washington Square on May 18th to proclaim once again that "The streets belong to the people!"

Dissent to Resistance to Rebellion

DEAR FRIENDS:

Most of the information the American public has received on the Vietnam war has been from pro-war or "pro-U. S." and government sources

The majority of the people directly involved in this war, the 26 million NLF and DRV Vietnamese, seldom catch our eyes or ears - except as casualties or in brief distorted quotes filtered through the western press.

The Vietnamese films (NLF and DRV) described in the enclosed catalog are definitely not Hollywood productions. Their film laboratories are often crude and sometimes literally "underground!"

There are many reasons why these films have had successful showings in over 200 cities in the last year. Shown to peace groups, community groups, on TV, etc., they have helped Americans see the problem from the Vietnamese point of view, helped make the Vietnamese understandable as real people and generally helped to counter the "Anti-Vietnamese" propaganda. Many groups have found the film showings very useful in sparking interest and controversy and in raising funds.

RENTAL TERMS are designed to make enough copies available for showings and to pay for obtaining newer and better Vietnamese films.


DEPOSITS can be waived if an organization will guarantee to replace the films if they are unreturnable for any reason.

WE ASK YOU to give the Vietnamese a hearing. See if you can arrange - not only local showings by your group and others - but perhaps a "film-in" on your local commercial or educational TV.


DEAR FRIENDS:

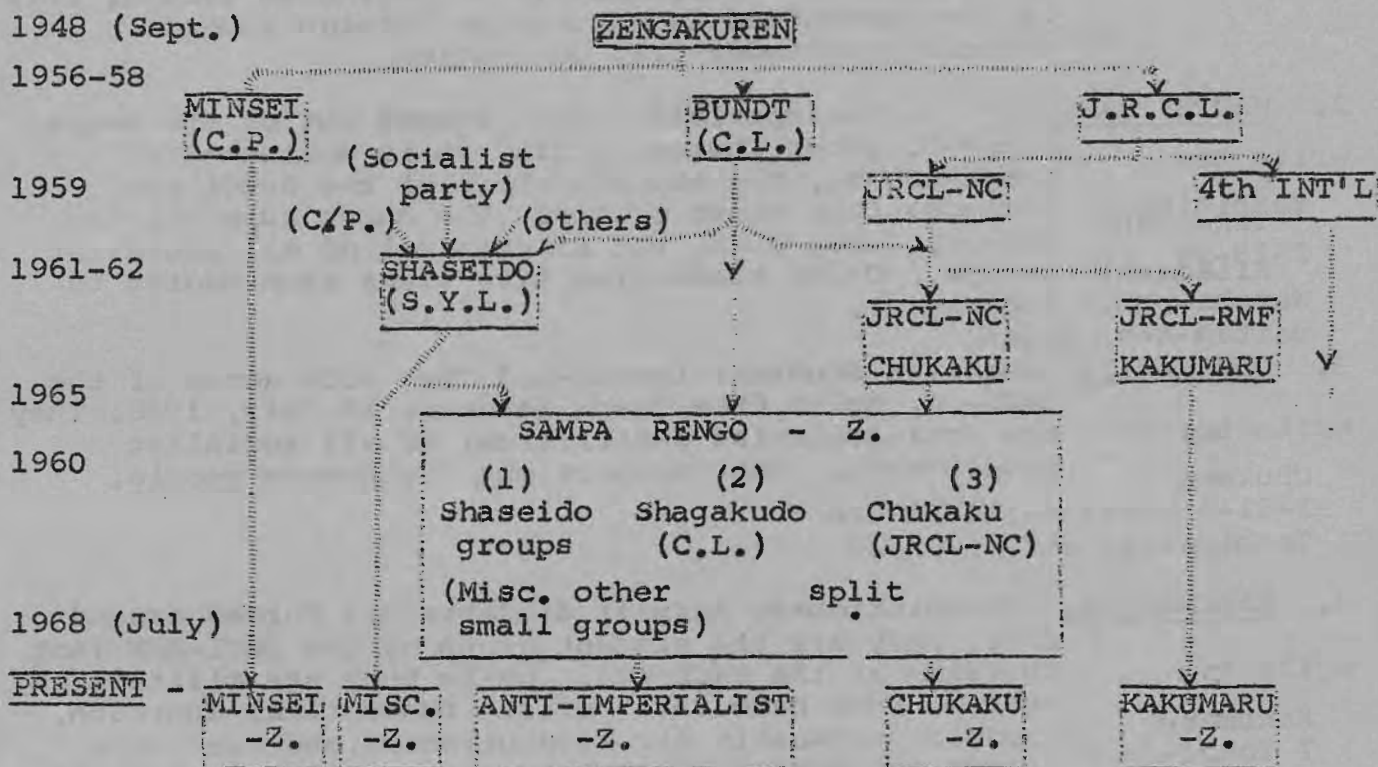

ZENGAKUREN

(Simplified Chart)



ZENGAKUREN translates best as: "All Japan Federation of Student Autonomous Associations"

The Japanese student movement got its start in 1948 as a result of struggles against tuition raises and a strike of 114 universities. The Zengakuren (Z.) was founded at a rally held 18-20 Sept., 1948 in Tokyo and was dominated initially by the Japanese Communist Party's (JCP) youth group.

In 1956 new militant Zengakuren factions were formed in response to the failures of the JCP's policies. Since 1956 all the major student struggles have been initiated and led by the militant Zengakuren factions.

In 1959-60 the struggle of the Zengakuren to prevent ratification of the Japan-U.S. Mutual Security Treaty (AMPO) was waged with fierce street actions involving tens of thousands of students, young workers and citizens. While these actions were a new high in political and street action for the Zengakuren, they failed to stop the treaty and the Zengakuren factions went through a period of reorganization until 1965. This was especially true of the faction that led the '59-60 struggle, the Bundt (Communist League) faction of the Z.

In Dec., 1966 the Sampa Rengo (Three faction) Zengakuren was formed by an alliance of the three main tendencies of (1) Shagakudo, (2) Chukaku and (3) Shaseido. Shagakudo is the student group of the Bundt. Chukaku is the student group of the Japanese Revolutionary Communist League-National Committee (JRCL-NC). Shaseido means Socialist Youth League and several groups in Shaseido formed the third tendency. Sampa Rengo Z. included additional small groups.

Parallel to the Sampa Rengo Z., two other Zengakurens existed. The JCP's Z., Minsei, continued from 1948 to the present. The Kakumaru (JRCL-Revolutionary Marxist Faction = JRCL-RMF) had formed its own Zengakuren around 1962 and it too continued to the present.

In July, 1968 Chukaku-Z. split from Sampa Rengo-Z. and the remaining groups formed what is now known as the Hantei Gaku Hyo (Anti-Imperialist Zengakuren).

Each major political tendency among the students competes for control of the 510 self-governing university student governments representing over 800,000 students. Today there are 5 major Z's, each calling itself "the Zengakuren." Each of these represents a number of university governments, sometimes cooperating, sometimes not.

1. MINSEI-Z. (Democratic Youth League-Z.) This is the largest and original Zengakuren and is controled by the Japanese Communist Party's youth group. It is reformist and parliamentarian and has often attempted to stifle activities of the more radical Zengakuren groups. This is the recognized Zengakuren by foreign student associations under C.P. domination.

2. HANTEI Z. (Anti-Imperialist Z.) Formed out of the Sampa Rengo-Z. after the split, it is dominated by Shagakudo-Z., the student group of the Bundt and includes four other groups. The Bundt supports the NLF-SV, Cuba, OLAS, but is critical of all socialist groups. Other tendencies have views from Maoist to Trotskyist.

3. CHUKAKU-Z. (Marxist Students League-Z.) The youth group of the JRCL-NC, split from Sampa Rengo-Z. in July, 1968. They are anti-Stalinist and critical of all socialist governments. They support the Vietnamese people.

4. KAKUMARU-Z. (Revolutionary Marxist Students-Z.) Formed around 1962, they are the student group of the JRCL-RMF (not the same as the JRCL-NC). While they are militant and active, they have the "purist" theoretical approach, apposing virtually all revolutionary, and guerrilla groups and socialist governments as being inadequate for the world-proletarian revolution. They say they are strongly "Anti-Stalinist."

5. MISCELLANEOUS-Z's There are other, smaller Z. groups, some active and militant, some reformist and inactive.

RECENT ZENGAKUREN ACTIVITIES

Aug. 23: 20 Students from both Okinawa and mainland Japan entered the mainland from Okinawa without using their passports as required by both the U.S. and Japanese governments. They then publically burned their passports. Their action was supported by Chukaku, Beheiren - a peace group, and young workers.

Aug. 15: Okinawan students picketed the U.S. Kadena Air Base on Okinawa and were arrested.

Sept.: The struggles at the Japanese universities began anew (over 50 Universities were involved last year) with actions at Univ. of Tokyo (the top elite university in Japan) and Nippon University (the "worst and most commercial university - actually a corporation).

AUG. 3RD INTERNATIONAL UNIFIED ANTI-WAR CONFERENCE. Held on Aug. 2 and 3rd in Tokyo and in other cities on following days, it was organized by the Hantei -Z. and was attended by all the militant Z's except Kakumaru-Z. which held its own somewhat similar conference. The conference resolved that:

"We will:

1. Dedicate the week of Oct. 21 to 26 as a week of International actions for the victory of the Vietnamese revolution and to fight the Japanese-U.S. Mutual Security Treaty and NATO.
2. Organize for the overthrow of U.S. rule of Okinawa and removal of U.S. bases from Okinawa and mainland Japan.
3. Organize direct action against Premier Sato's Jan. and June, 1969 visits to the U.S., struggle in Wash., D.C. and at Haneda Airport.
4. Organize International actions against reorganization of Nato and ASPAC (Asian and Pacific Counsel) in Sept. 1969.
5. Organize armed struggles, strikes, demonstrations and rallies to prevent the re-adoption of the Japan-U.S. Security Treaty in 1970.
6. Organize struggle in solidarity with the revolutionary people in Latin America to crush Organization of American States."

NEWSLETTER

21 July 1968

Dear Friends:

Since our last letter many good things have happened to us, to the Movement and most importantly, in Vietnam. The South Vietnam National Front for Liberation is in firm control of the countryside and its' front lines are in the cities. By the time this reaches you there may not be a "Saigon Regime" !

The main purpose of this letter is to raise some money for general expenses and for the representation of our group at the Japan Congress Against A and H Bombs to be held at Tokyo, Hiroshima, Nagasaki and Okinawa from July 25th until August 15th. This will enable our chairman to meet with representatives of the many groups in Japan and Okinawa, working against the Vietnam War. More of this further on.

BRINGING YOU UP TO DATE:

Jan. 24: DIAMOND BALL DEMONSTRATION: held at the Plaza Hotel. It was the first demonstration by the groups to later form the Coalition for an Anti-Imperialist Movement. (CoAim)

March: WORKSHOP ON TACTICAL STREET ACTION: started in March, this group brought in many independents and provided a forum. Many small experimental demonstrations were held in NYC.

COMMITTEE SPEAKERS AT: Pratt -- Bennington -- Malloy, etc.

April 27th: On this day Mayor Lindsay spoke at the Sheep Meadow while his goons and aids attacked Coalition in Washington Square Park. Yet over 150 made it to the Sheep Meadow and then left to support the Columbia Students.

Our original purpose in deciding to set up a separate feeder march was to draw attention to an anti-Imperialist and pro-NLF and Liberation struggle line of protest as apposed to the vague and compromising line of the Parade Committee. We would march to and through the crowd at the Sheep Meadow, calling people to our own rally nearby where we would have speakers supporting the Liberation struggles throughout the world and denouncing Imperialism, Racism and Lindsay and his Nazi "Emergency Laws".

With the developments of Lindsay being invited to speak at the Sheep Meadow and the Columbia strike, we decided we would call upon people to leave Lindsay and come join us in support of the Columbia Students in the Liberated Buildings.

Obviously Lindsay didn't want hundreds of young people storming through the park and denouncing him and maybe getting a large part of the crowd to go to Columbia. As it was when some people at the end of the rally did leave to go to Columbia, the police attacked them too.

Several days before the 27th, S.N.C.C. announced it would boycott the Sheep Meadow if Lindsay remained a speaker -we agreed whole-heartedly and what had been a "Coalition for an Anti-Imperialist Feeder March" became a "Coalition for an Anti-Imperialist Movement!"

Those who then claimed that Lindsay's presense would bring out greater numbers--what they really meant was greater respectability, respectability from whome?--and ignored S.N.C.C.'s principaled descision, now shamefacedly talk of militant response to another police (Lindsay's) attack on the Black Community even suggesting Times Square! A giant step backwards and baby step forward!

After the 27th, we decided we would return to Washington Square, hold our own rally - against Lindsay, his Police, the Emergency Laws and the Vietnam War. This would either prove our right and ability to demonstrate or force the Police to expose their true nature. Either way we would win. If the Police attacked again it would doubly condemn them. If they didn't we would be able to take the streets freely and prove our right to have done so on the first occasion.

MAY 18TH - THE STREETS BELONG TO THE PEOPLE!

We returned and all went like clockwork, even the New York Times had to admit that we "fooled" and "outwitted" the police. A 20 foot NLF banner was lowered from the top of the Washington Square Arch by Dave Sughey. The cops couldn't get it down. The marchers eluded the police and "liberated" the Lower East Side streets for several hours. Our people were very encouraged and the Coalition (CoAim) was firmly established.

Since then we have had many small and large demonstrations and a recent conference at the Diplomat Hotel. There are now over 15 groups associated with CoAim and our first major demonstration call will be against Hubert Humphrey on the 23rd in NYC.

MAY 30TH - COLUMBIA

Many of our people were active at Columbia our NLF banner flew from the tops of several buildings. Among those arrested was Walter Teague picked up on another "inciting to riot" and "possession of a dangerous weapon" when actually he had been helping one of the University Chaplains reach medical treatment. Spotted by a member of the New Yorks Red Squad", he was seized - all his identification stolen by the police and arrested.

Since our last letter of 19 Jan., we did get a better typewriter - as you can see - on loan from Jim H. He and Pat are now out of the country traveling. Another member, Donald H. is looking at cement factories and other things in Cuba.

TOKYO - HIROSHIMA - NAGASAKI - FUKUOKA - OKINAWA - AND BACK!

Several weeks ago, GENUIKIN, (Japan Congress Against A and H Bombs) the largest Anti-war group in Japan invited a representative from our group to their Aug. 3rd to 15th conferences and rallies. We replied that while it would be a very good thing to have the "radical left" represented, it was beyond our means. They then sent a cable offering to pay for part of the expenses and asking our representative to arrive on the 24th of July to speak at regional conferences and gatherings. We wired them our acceptance, even though our part of the expenses would be minimum of over \$700.

Our chairman, Walter Teague, will leave S.F. on the 23rd to speak in Japan and Okinawa, meeting with all possible groups and tendencies, and return around the 15th of August. Whether he can stay the full time or perhaps go on to Cambodia, will depend on your response. The close friends of the committee have contributed - besides the most necessary help of those who are broke - the following: H.W.=\$150., J.S.= \$100., R.P. & S.K.=\$75., C.C.=\$5., J.H.= \$100., G.B.=\$25., and N.B.=\$50

This means we must raise - over the \$252.00 cost of this mailing at least \$267.00. If we were able to raise another \$500., it would be better.

"All this we ask and more" Our creditors - landlord - and the many valuable projects all cry out!!!

According to our information, this is the first time a radical left group has been invited and been able to accept. The Japanese Movement in all its various tendencies should be acquainted with more than the pacifist and moderate left. So help our guy remain there the full time and return. It wouldn't be right for him to have to sponge off his hosts.

We will send you a full report - after the 15th.

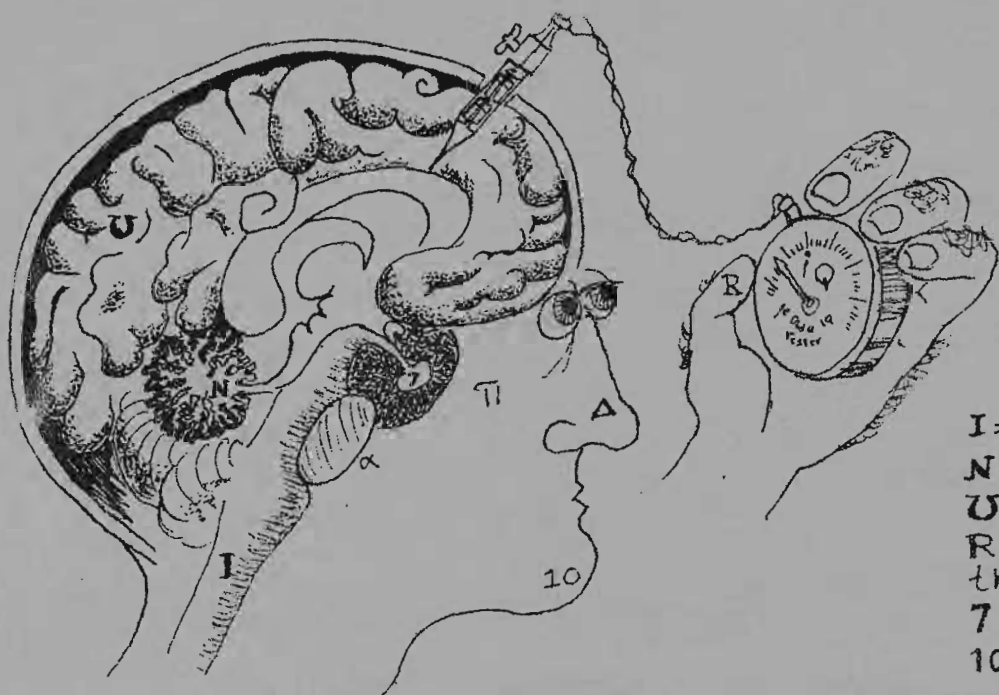

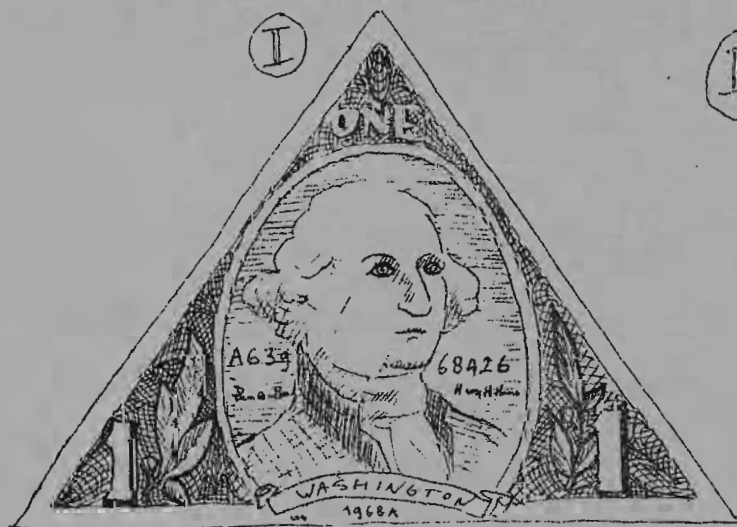

Carola Hoffman, representative of the WORKSHOP to Co-Aim and an organizer of the street meeting, was arrested and charged with resisting arrest and arson. The others arrested were also local people who were attacked by these invading, outsider cops.
