- 2. Dealing with the draft: counseling, COs, resistance, the prison experience, exile, amnesty
- 3. Students and universities: SDS, teach-ins, strikes, Kent State, Jackson State
- 4. Religious communities: CALC, NCC, Bishops, Berrigan inspired direct action
- 5. Organizing and Participating in Mass Actions: SDS march, Pentagon, National Mobilizations (East and West Coast), Chicago Convention, May Day, March Against Death, Oakland
